

## SLaAN. <br> Waterfree



Before Starting Installation $\square$ Check rough-in height to achieve 24 " rim height
$\square$ Check slope. Downhill slope, per code, is essential because waterfree urinals depend on gravity flow.
$\square$ Check DWV material. Suitable materials include cast iron, PVC, ABS, and galvanized steel. Do not install on copper DWV due to copper's
susceptibility to corrosion.
$\square$ Shut off water supply and ca
$\square$ Shut off water supply and cap the nipple with
the $3 / 4$ chrome cap (provided).

If standing water is present, adjust drain to achieve pitch (code requires $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ drop per foot of drain line for proper pitch). Seal wall according to code.


Determine the drain nipple depth by Determine the drain nipple depth by
measuring the distance between the back of the sanitary tee (or elbow) to the front edge of the brass flange.


Install the gear clamp with the screw head at the bottom, but do not tighten.


Use utility knife to cut caulk, then use a putty knife and mallet to remove the bowl. Remove hanger brackets, scrape off caulk, and clean the wall.


Measure and mark the rough-in. Use a $5 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ masonry bit to drill hole, then install the hanger bracket with one plastic anchor and screw.


Find the drain nipple depth on the cutting chart (left) and mark the specified trim length on the insert tube at the nearest $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ groove


Drill holes for the lower anchor screws and insert plastic anchors.


IMPORTANT: Use a drain machine to remove build-up inside pipes. Clean 25-35 feet deep then flush with water to remove cutting debris.


Level the bracket then mark, drill and install two additional plastic anchors and screws. If pre-existing bearing rods can be used, screws are not necessary.


Cut the tube at the groove using a sharp utility knife to ensure a square, flat cut. Clean burrs from the cut end with emery paper


Hang the bowl, inserting tailpipe into bushing, then install anchor screws with washers. Tighten flange bolts and gear clamp.


Clean face of existing wall flange then install the brass flange with the clear inspection disc. Slowly pour water into the drain.


Hang the bowl on the bracket and check tail pipe alignment, then remove the bowl and adjust the bracket as needed.


Apply lubricant to the outside of the rubber bushing and ribbed inside area. Insert the tube and bushing with the arrow tab at the top. Lube tailpipe of housing.


Pour 5 gallons of water as rapidly as possible into housing to ensure good flow and no leaks or standing water.


Use a flashlight to check pitch/slope. There should be no water present in he inspection disc or nipple. Remove flange after inspection.


Re-hang and re-ch bowl aliznment with the lin bowl alignment then remove the bowl without moving the hanger bracket.

lace the seal into the flange with the ribs facing out. Install the flange with washers and hex nuts, but do not tighten completely.


Caulk bowl to the wall. Install the cartridge per the cartridge instruction sheet.

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If standing water is present, adjust drain to achieve pitch (code requires $1 / 4^{4}$ drop per foot of drain line for proper pitch). Seal the wall according to code.


Determine the drain nipple depth by measuring the distance between the back of the sanitary tee (or elbow) to the front edge of the nipple.
 and insert plastic anchors


Set drain line height at $16^{3} / 4$ " from finished floor (standard $24^{\prime \prime}$ rim) or $9^{3 / 4}{ }^{4}$ for ADA installation. Threaded nipple should extend $1 / 2$ to $3 / 4$ from wall.


If in-wall carrier is not used, measure and mark the rough-in. Use a $5 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ masonry bit to drill hole, then install the hanger bracket with one plastic anchor and screw.


Find the drain nipple depth on the cutting chart (left) and mark the specified trim length on the insert tube at the nearest $1 / 4$ " groove.



Carrier stud placement: If using inwall carrier, set bearing rods as shown above.


Level the bracket then mark, drill and
install two additional plastic anchors and screws. If pre-existing bearing rods can be used, screws are not necessary.


Cut the tube at the groove using a sharp utility knife to ensure a square, flat cut. Clean burrs from the cut end with emery paper

clamp.


Clean face of existing wall flange then install the 2" compression nut with the clear inspection disc. Slowly pour water into the drain.


Hang the bowl on the bracket and
check tail pipe alignment, then remove the bowl and adjust the bracket as needed.


Apply lubricant to the outside of the rubber bushing and ribbed inside area. Insert the tube and bushing with the arrow tab at the top.


Pour 5 gallons of water as rapidly as possible into housing to ensure good flow and no leaks or standing water.


Use a flashlight to check pitch/slope. There should be no water present in he inspection disc or nipple. Remove compression nut after inspection.


Re-hang and re-check bowl alignment with the drain line. Mark anchor holes then remove the bowl without moving the hanger bracket.


Place the gear clamp and compression nut onto the housing tailpipe. Apply lubricant to the tailpipe.


Caulk bowl to the wall. Install the cartridge per the cartridge instruction sheet.
